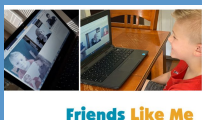

	Florida Virtual School (FLVS) offers ASL as a foreign language and students can meet other students who sign.		ASL Connect by Gallaudet University offers multiple ways to learn ASL. They also have an ASL summer residency program on campus.
	ASDC offers online classes on a variety of topics for families and children of all ages wanting to learn ASL. Prices posted for each workshop.		ASL at Home is a free family curriculum in English and Spanish for families to learn ASL with young children who are DHH.
	SignOn with ASDC connects families of children who are DHH with a Deaf ASL ambassador for one-on-one ASL practice and mentoring.		American Sign Language University (ASLU) has free self-study resources or for a fee learners can have an instructor-guided course.
	Friends Like Me with ASDC provides a DHH adult mentor to facilitate weekly meetups to connect children who are DHH with peers of the same age to engage in conversation.		SignIt ASL is an online course for adults and kids ages 8+. It is free for families of children who are DHH ages 0-36 months.
Local Community Resources	Every community is different, but ASL classes may be available at local places such as colleges, community education opportunities at public schools, churches, and independent living resource centers.	Online Resources	A variety of resources can be found online that provide synchronous or asynchronous ASL lessons. It is recommended to check the teacher's or organization's credentials to ensure accurate information is shared.

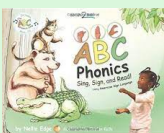
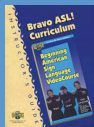
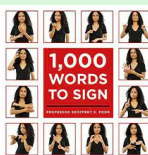
